Second-Hand Uniform Shop

The Second-Hand Uniform Shop operates every Thursday afternoon from 3 til 3.30pm. It is situated in A block, up the stairs from the entrance way to the Office from the carpark and is run by a few dedicated volunteers. We are really keen to have some more uniform items to sell. Remember that we sell on consignment: the owner of the uniform gets 70% of our selling price (which is determined by the quality of the item, usually half the new price), and the school keeps 30%. We process our sales at the end of each term and the amounts owed are deposited into your child's school account, or directly into your bank account if your child has left the school.

Please fill out a form with all your details and the items you are selling. These are available at the office and there is one printed in this newsletter. We are always happy to accept donations as well – just drop them off at the school office.

Currently we have lots of shorts and trousers, but mostly secondary student sizes, including some extra large. We only have a couple of smaller sized blazers, so are keen to have others to sell. We have jumpers in a range of sizes, from very small to very large. There are a lot of the old-style spray jackets which are still acceptable as sports jackets. New Hope – Street Art & Hip Hope

New Hope is a weekly program that aims to enhance participants skills in hip hop and street art lead by experienced mentors. The program supports young people to develop skills in writing lyrics and producing rap music guided by rappers and producers working in the industry. The combined street art program is a graffiti art based program that aims to deter young people from vandalism related offences and provides opportunities for young people to develop their street art skills. The program is supported by experienced Youth workers who work alongside the industry specialists. New Hope provides opportunities to record, perform and work on community street art murals throughout the year.

External Program Highlight: Road Smart – Vic Roads

Road Smart is a road safety education program for Year 10 students in Victoria, funded by the Victorian Government and delivered free for schools and TAFEs. The program has been developed in accordance with the Victorian Curriculum and draws on relevant research for school-based road safety education and change. It includes:

- 60-70 min in-class session delivered by a trained facilitator at schools (we have also developed an "online" option, delivered by our facilitators, into the classroom or while students are learning remotely)
- Learning modules for students and supervising drivers
- A free practical driving session delivered outside of school hours
- A teacher resource toolkit linked to the Victorian Curriculum.
- All Road Smart Facilitators have completed COVID-Safe training and practice safe hygiene procedures.

VicRoads Learner Permit Test Online (LPTO)

Dear Stakeholders,

All prospective learners from across the state are now able to sign up and enrol in the new Learner Permit Test Online (LPTO).

The LPTO equips learners with the road rules information and foundational road safety knowledge they need to obtain a learner permit and to be a safe driver.

The LPTO has been informed by research in youth development and road safety behaviours and harnesses technology and contemporary education methods to deliver a more effective learning tool than the current paper-based system.

While the LPTO has designed to be interactive and user-friendly, the involvement of supportive adults/supervisor drivers as the learner progress through the learning modules is encouraged. Some young people may need additional assistance to undertake the LPTO. This support could involve providing access to wifi or assisting with learning for learners with literacy or difficulties reading English.

About the LPTO

The Learner Permit Test Online (LPTO) is a 4-6-hour interactive course and assessment that teaches new drivers about the road rules to follow when driving in Victoria and important ways to develop safe driving behaviours. Applicants can self-enrol and complete the course online using any compatible device.

The LPTO is a competency-based course focusing on road safety (including safe systems, vehicles, speed, routes, drink and drug driving, seatbelts, fatigue and distractions) and road rules (including parking, hazardous situations, giving way, road signs, road markings, licence sanctions and sharing the road with others).

The new test includes a mix of theory, interactive videos and visual graphics to reinforce road safety messages. Applicants move through 'gated' topics by reading road safety information and answering mini quizzes to check their understanding of the topic before they progress through to the final assessment.

The LPTO can be accessed through a myVicRoads account, allowing customers to complete the course at their own pace and attempt the final assessment when ready.

When the online course and assessment has been successfully completed, learner drivers need to attend a VicRoads Customer Service Centre (once circuit breaker restrictions are eased) to confirm their identity, have their photo taken and complete an eyesight check.

Learners will be able to access the course and assessment 12 months from when they enrolled.

Outside of COVID-19 restriction periods, learners can still sit the Learner Permit Test in person at their nearest VicRoads Customer Service Centres. Learners requiring interpreter services support will need to attend the test in-person at a Customer Service Centre.
