
Carols by Candlelight 2020





For Girls, we offer the chance to join our open age program, where we will focus developing our young players for future success!



TYSS - Transitional Youth Support Services

Youth Housing Support workers offer assertive outreach and support to young single people or young families aged 16-25 who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.

Youth Housing Support workers can assist with:

- · Information about housing options,
- Assistance to access the homelessness service system
- Completion and lodgement of Office of Housing applications
- Support and information on how to access the private rental market, including applying for Bond Loans
- Referrals to other specialist services, such as counselling, employment, education, family mediation and reconciliation
- · Advice on Office of Housing issues.

Young people are supported to access the homelessness service system and register for transitional housing and support.

Assistance will be provided during the young person's engagement with the Program to develop a plan to achieve long term housing, and build on strengths to support goals they would like to work towards, increase independent living skills and develop links with the community.

Young people may be accommodated in Transitional Accommodation or still seeking stable accommodation.

TTI - Transition to Independence

The TTI program offers accommodation to young people aged 16-25 who have become homeless

and are attempting to complete their education, with a focus on VCE and early tertiary studies. Accommodation is provided for up to four young people at any one time in a shared property in the northern area.

Young people can continue their education without interruption while they are supported to seek a long term affordable housing option, utilising training or employment as an exit pathway to independence.

The TTI program can provide limited housing support to young people within the property for a period of up to two years.

Due to the level of independence required to sustain this accommodation option, young people need to have sufficient living skills to maintain their tenancy as intensive case management is not provided.

Young people must be eligible for youth allowance/have some source of income to afford rent at the transitional housing rates of 25% of income.

HIP - Homelessness Intervention & Prevention

An early intervention response to young people aged 16-25 who are at risk of homelessness due to family breakdown.

Assessment and advice in relation to issues that may be impacting on a young person's accommodation with their family is provided, and opportunities are explored to facilitate family reconciliation or mediation with the aim of the young person being able to remain at home.


Where counselling is identified as appropriate referrals can be made to other Berry Street

support programs or community suppor

Where the young person has already made contact with the homelessness service system and is newly homeless, Youth Housing Support workers can provide support to-explore alternate family options, assistance with unresolved personal or family issues with a focus on re-establishing positive relationships with family and community. Young people can be referred to HIP from their school, a support worker or agency, or they can contact direct.
