NAPLAN for years 3, 5, 7 & 9 will be held during the period Tuesday $14^{\rm h}$ - Friday $24^{\rm th}$ May.

VCE General Achievement Test (GAT) & Practice Exams. What is the GAT?

The GAT is a three-hour general knowledge and skills test in written communication, mathematics, science, technology, humanities, the arts and social sciences.

Practice GAT: Wednesday 22nd May, 10am - 1pm

All Year 11 & 12 students will be undertaking the Practice GAT. Period 1 classes will run as normal on this day and all students will be dismissed at the conclusion of the GAT.

This experience provides important exam practice, as well as increases the likelihood of positively influencing the actual GAT results, and furthermore final VCE results. The Practice GAT will be marked and feedback will be provided to all students.

VCE Exams

Year 11 exams and Year 12 practice exams will be held on Thursday 6th, Friday 7^h June, Tuesday 11th June, Thursday 13th June and Friday 14th (Monday 10th June - Queens Birthday, Wednesday 12th June - GAT).

Students will only need to be at school for timetabled exams and must be in full school uniform.

Thorough revision and effort in these exams lays a strong foundation for success at the end of Year 12. Students should set high expectations for their own achievement and seek advice and support from their teachers. Exam results and feedback will be provided to all students.

GAT

The 2019 GAT will take place on Wednesday 12th June from 10am - 1.15pm. The GAT is compulsory for all students undertaking a Unit 3/4 subject. No VCE classes or exams (Year 11 or 12) will run on this day.

Students are expected to be at school by 9am in full school uniform. Students must know their VCAA student number, which can be obtained from their Student Manager.

Students may bring pens, pencils, sharpeners, erasers and an English and/or bilingual dictionary into the GAT.

No phones, calculators, blank sheets of paper, liquid white out/tape or a thesaurus are permitted.

Normal classes will resume on Monday 17th June.

Safer speed limit on Kingsbury Drive, Bundoora

What's happening

New 60km/h speed limit on Kingsbury Drive will apply from Friday 12 April 2019 to increase safety for motorists, pedestrians and cyclists.

Background

La Trobe University are building a new sports park adjacent to Kingsbury Drive, separate from their Bundoora campus.

The new sports park will significantly increase pedestrian volumes on this road as visitors cross over Kingsbury Drive to access the new area from the Bundoora campus.



New 60km/h speed limit along Kingsbury Drive

About the project

Following a safety review, we'll be reducing the speed limit from 70km/h to 60km/h on Kingsbury Drive from Friday 12 April 2019. We're also installing new pedestrian operated signals to ensure the area is safe for everyone.

The reduced speed limit will allow drivers enough time to respond to signals and improve their ability to stop and avoid crashes. A left in, left out access will be built at the new carpark. Traffic turning right onto Kingsbury Drive from the carpark will need to make a U-turn at the Kingsbury Drive and Plenty Road intersection.

Slow down and watch out for pedestrians.

Tip of the Week

The purpose of an above-ground heat bed is to raise seedlings in punnets or plants in pots where they can't tolerate cold roots in the winter. Such a bed is best placed inside a greenhouse or in a place protected from cold air. Simply create a box using wood or bricks, or even use a polystyrene box. Fill the base with fresh, preferably steaming, animal manure, and cover with 2-4cm of sand or soil. The decomposing manure will heat the layer of soil on top. Insert your seedling punnets or potted plants a couple of centimetres into the soil layer and you have a heat bed.
